Firbank Grammar was created as the result of a bequest from UK-based clergyman Canon Greene. In 1908, Anglican Archbishop Henry Lowther Clarke used Canon Greene's gift to help establish a new school for girls so they could experience the same educational opportunities as their brothers.

Although Firbank today is vastly different from this early school, our founding values endure. Our vision remains to provide students with an outstanding education and all the opportunities it brings.

Our history contains many examples of Old Grammarians, teachers and friends who have chosen to make a Gift through their Will to help provide life changing opportunities for students.

A Gift from Noelle Schollenberger (1947) provides scholarships for regional students so they can experience all the opportunities of a Firbank education. A Gift from Merrin James (1970) supports an annual Fellowship for Old Grammarians.

Others have chosen to direct their Gifts to programs including The Arts, Music and Drama.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why leave a Gift in your Will?

Leaving a Gift in your Will is a simple but powerful way to care for your loved ones and support the causes that matter the most to you. It transforms your Will into one of the most potent tools for change there is.

A Gift in your Will costs you nothing today but has the capacity to transform lives in the future.

How do I include a Gift in my Will?

Whether or not you already have a Will, the easiest way to leave a Gift is to seek the help of a solicitor who offers a Will-writing service. You can also contact the Law Institute of Victoria, CPA Australia, or the Institute of Chartered Accountants.

Once you have written your Will, we suggest sharing your intentions with your loved ones.

What are the different types of Gifts?

There are several different ways you can remember Fribank Grammar in your Will. Here are three of the most common:

- A **Residual Gift** is simply whatever is left of your estate after you have provided for your family and friends.
- A **Percentage Gift** is the amount of your estate that you would like to leave.
- A **Specific Gift** can be a specified cash amount, or other assets of value such as real estate, shares, or art works.

Regardless of how you choose to make your Gift, you will be helping future generations.

HOW CAN MY GIFT MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

You can choose how your Gift is applied and how it will make a difference to future Firbank students.

You can direct your gift to:

- The **Firbank Grammar Scholarship Fund** and give the gift of education to students who otherwise would not be able to attend Firbank. Your Gift will help provide Academic, Music, Boarding and Indigenous Scholarships and Bursaries. You can also choose to establish a named perpetual scholarship to provide a half or full scholarship. - The **Firbank Grammar Building Fund** and help provide students with modern teaching, sport, and recreational facilities.
- The **Firbank Grammar Library Fund** and help provide students with access to books and online resources.

Or you can choose to leave an unrestricted Gift and enable our Principal to direct your Gift to the area of greatest need.
